

## Overview

All Saints National is situated in the centre of Bloxwich, in the borough of Walsall and accessible from Junction 11 on the M6. There are 255 pupils in the academy. Within the academy there are 53% pupil premium and 54% of pupils eligible for free school meals.(well above the national average) 8% of pupils have English as an additional language and 14% of pupils have special educational needs.

The academy was inspected in June 2021 (Section 8) being monitored as an academy in special measures. There were positive aspects of the inspection including:

Leaders have taken steps to design an effective curriculum. With the support of the trust, significant work has been undertaken to create detailed plans. These plans are in place for each year group and cover all subjects. Progression and sequencing are evident.

Reading is strongly promoted across the school. Key texts link to all class topics. Allstaff have received reading training, including phonics for key stage 2 staff. Pupils read daily in school and are encouraged to read regularly at home.

Leaders have taken effective action to improve the quality of education in mathematics. This is well led, well planned and appropriately sequenced. Curriculum intent is established, coherent and comparable to national expectations (Ofsted June 2021)

However, the inspector also stated:

Repeated school closures, significant staff and pupil absence, and the absence of on-site monitoring by the Trust and Local Academy Committee due to COVID 19 restrictions have contributed to the reduced effectiveness of leaders' actions.

The current leadership team continue to work hard focussing on the key priorities with all staff with the support of the Trust, external agencies and the Local Academy Committee:

The trust has provided valuable support to staff and school leaders. The learning director and diocesan improvement adviser have a strong knowledge of the school. They have supported curriculum planning and subject leadership training and have carried out monitoring and review activities to keep a check onthe progress the school is making.

The Trust is currently working with the Regional School Commissioner to facilitate the academy transferring to another Trust who will continue to work with the academy to secure even more improvements.

The children at All Saints National Academy are proud of their school and their teachers and enjoy coming to school. Attendance has improved significantly and pupils share that they enjoy learning. Parents have been active in supporting their children's learning and have taken advantages of work shops in phonics and mathematics.
