

Sessions include


- Who Am I?

"Reflect on the wonder of the incarnation this Advent – the infinite life found in the small infant Jesus and how he invites you to do wonderful work with him, right where you are."



Biblical characters in the story of the incarnation are called to set out on the road to discipleship using any means of carriage they can. This book offers user-friendly encouragement (with the occasional spur onwards) to explore what helps and what hinders us in this journey to deeper encounter with the flesh and blood God whom we find in scripture, in our lived experience and in the least of his sisters and brothers.




Wild Advent by Rachel Summers

Wild Advent provides an outdoor activity for each day of the four weeks of Advent, progressing through the Carmelite themes for Advent of Waiting, Accepting, Journeying, and Birthing.

Recommended for children and families wanting practical activities.



Worship for Everyone Advent Journal by Nick and Becky Drake

Explore four traditional themes – hope, peace, joy and love – accompanied by scripture and Worship For Everyone songs. There's be space to doodle and write down your thoughts and prayers as you connect with God each day.




They Sang by Amy Scott Robinson

An Advent Course based on the four songs in the Christmas story

In the nativity story, there are four sudden, Spirit-filled songs from the heart, and they're all still used in the rhythm of liturgy: Zechariah's song (the Benedictus) Mary's song (Magnificat) the song of the angels (Gloria in Excelsis) and Simeon's song (Nunc Dimittis).

In 'They Sang', Amy Scott Robinson uses four Advent studies to guide small groups to explore these ancient poems of praise and prophecy, and a fifth invites you to discover your own song.
