Tues 29th: (Thomas Becket, Archbishop of Canterbury, Martyr, 1170)

May God the Father keep you in all your days. May God the Son shield you in all your ways. May God the Spirit bring you healing and peace. May God the Holy Trinity drive all darkness from you and pour upon you blessing and light. **Amen.**

Wed 30th:

O Christ who holds the open gate, open the gate of our hearts to your love.

O Christ who drives the furrow straight, guide our living and our loving by your mark of love.

O Christ the plough, cut through all that limits us, overturn our wilfulness.

O Christ the laughter of holy white birds flying after, awaken us to the laughter of all creation, in harmony with you.

Sat 2nd: (Basil the Great and Gregory of Nazianzus, Bishops, Teachers of the Faith, 379 and 389, Seraphim, Monk of Sarov, Spiritual Guide, 1833, Vedanayagam Samuel Azariah, Bishop in South India, Evangelist, 1945))
