Lighting and Vision	
Are lighting levels constant throughout the building?	
Is there adequate artificial/natural lighting?	
Hearing loops	
Is there a hearing induction loop?	

Is it always used?	
Is it regularly tested?	
Can all areas be reached by a wheelchair?	
Are any steps or ramps well lit and have rails?	
Can everyone access the emergency exits?	
Is there a quiet space people can withdraw to if they become anxious?	
Toilets	
Do you have a toilet?	
If not what arrangements are available for people?	
Is it fully accessible?	
Does it have an alarm system?	
Is the toilet seat a contrasting colour to the surrounding walls?
