The DAC last considered the proposal as an application for informal advice at 4th October 2023 DAC meeting, when the Committee offered advice on the development of the scheme. At the present meeting, the DAC carefully considered the updated proposal and the supporting documents, including the Statement of Significance (and associated Heritage Impact Assessment) and Statement of Needs. The Committee continued to support the principle of the proposal, and considered that the impact of the proposed works on the fabric of the listed church building had been sufficiently identified and justified.

In relation to the development of the scheme, the DAC offered the following advice:

- The Committee confirmed that the matters previously raised by the DAC's informal advice had been considered, and that the current submission includes a wide range of new and updated supporting documents relating to the architectural proposals (plans, elevations, sections and 3D details), the internal contents, and the mechanical and electrical (M&E) aspects of the reordering scheme. It was noted, though, that the replacement stained glass (east window) and the furniture/chairs do not form part of the current submission.
- 2. The DAC observed that the architect's latest proposed floor plan, drawing no. 6239-011D (dated 2nd November 2023), retains the same general strategy, with altar, dais and ramp to the east, octagonal quiet space to the west, and a two-storey enclosure in the south aisle, with toilets, a servery and a meeting room over. This remains generally workable.
- 3. In light of previous DAC advice, the design has been further developed and certain refinements made. The Committee made the following observations and comments on these various elements, below.
- 4. The nave altar dais now thrusts forward, is polygonal and should be more successful, both in terms of function and aesthetics.
- 5. The altar dais ramp is now handled cleanly, although it is still set in space rather than, for example, being tucked against a wall. Some caution was expressed regarding the internal planting bed screening, but which was considered to be an interesting idea.
- 6. There is now level access into the octagonal quiet space, which is tidier, simpler and more successful, both in terms of function and aesthetics.
- 7. The south aisle enclosure is still a sizeable and somewhat bulky intervention, but the elevations are fairly clean, and the insertion would be set behind the arcade. However, it was cautioned that it does not clear the pier capitals by much at the west end, and the suggestion was made that it needs to be moved south by at least 200 mm or so. Access issues to the upper level were considered to remain.
- 8. Designs have been submitted for the various screens to the quiet space, the tower arch, the ramp and new enclosure, and for dado panelling. Whilst this all looks fairly tidy, it is not clear what is intended by the wide mitreing this is not how doors are jointed, and it is not obvious how it will apply to the various panels. Large-scale joinery sections are needed.
- 9. Further to which, it was suggested that the loosely Gothic forms may not be necessary. The view was expressed that these are arguably a safe option, and that advice had previously been given that braver, more contemporary forms could work.
- 10. The servery is now worked up, but the hatch looks somewhat constricted.
- 11. The welcome desk is not now apparent. If one is intended, then large-scale details are required.
- 12. Care should be taken with the proposal for chairs, as these will be a crucial part of the finished aesthetic, in this fairly stripped-out interior. Chairs and tables will also need to be efficient stackers, as there is not a lot of enclosed storage space.
- 13. In relation to the M&E aspects of the reordering scheme, the DAC Audio-Visual, Lighting and Electrics Adviser undertook a site visit on 23rd September 2023 and met with parish representatives at the church (no written report). For the present DAC meeting, the Adviser provided extensive comments on the submitted M&E elements and related considerations, from a technical standpoint, but has expressed concern regarding the proposals.
- 14. The Committee agreed that this response be conveyed to the parish as the additional informal advice of that Adviser, and further commented that it would be helpful were the Archdeacon of Stoke-upon-Trent (in absentia) to lead a facilitated site meeting to discuss the points raised with the parish.

It was determined that external formal consultation under the Faculty Jurisdiction (Amendment) Rules 2022 is applicable. The Committee suggested that the revised scheme, when further developed, should be resubmitted for additional informal DAC advice, and that external informal consultation (pre-application advice) should also be undertaken with Historic England, the Victorian Society, and the Local Planning Authority (Conservation Officer).

The DAC last considered the proposal as an application for informal advice at 4th October 2023 DAC meeting, when the Committee offered advice on the development of the scheme. At the present meeting, the DAC carefully considered the updated proposal and the supporting documents, including the Statements of Significance and Needs, and confirmed that the matters previously raised by the Committee's informal advice had been addressed.

In relation to which, the QI architect has provided details of the manifestation to the doors and wording to the dedication panel over the doors. However, whilst these are generally acceptable, caution was expressed regarding the proposed solid white lettering. A sand-blasted (type) of finish, or transfer/applied film, would be preferable, as rather more recessive. The dedication text was deemed to be rather too prominent, and suggested to be smaller and to the side, whilst the manifestation might be a little larger to show the detail. Consideration should also be given to the font of the text elements, and a graphic designer perhaps engaged on the ensemble.

It was determined that external formal consultation under the Faculty Jurisdiction (Amendment) Rules 2022 is applicable. It was noted that Historic England, as an external statutory consultee,

has previously been consulted and has raised no objections. The Committee suggested that the revised scheme, when further developed, should be resubmitted for external formal consultation with Historic England and the Local Planning Authority (Conservation Officer), prior to receipt of formal DAC advice.

The DAC last considered the proposal as an application for formal advice at 23rd February 2023 DAC meeting, when the Committee deferred the application, pending revision and resubmission by the parish. At the present meeting, the DAC carefully considered the revised proposal and the supporting documents, including the Statements of Significance and Needs, and confirmed that the matters previously raised by the Committee's deferral advice had been addressed.

Specifically, the new screen and door frame will be oak in a light (natural) oil finish. The transom has been increased, and details of door closers are included. The manifestation is depicted and should be in sand-blasted effect. The external handrails are to be wrought iron to match the existing and are simply detailed. A Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) for an archaeological watching brief has also been provided, and approval of this document by the DAC Archaeology Adviser is confirmed. As such, the Committee resolved to recommend the proposal with a proviso.

It was determined that external formal consultation under the Faculty Jurisdiction 2015 is applicable. Following receipt of formal DAC advice, external formal consultation should be undertaken with Historic England, the Victorian Society, the Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings (SPAB), and the Local Planning Authority (Conservation Officer).

• The programme of archaeological work shall be carried out in complete accordance with the Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) for an archaeological watching brief by the Centre of Archaeology, Staffordshire University, dated 6th June 2023.

The DAC last considered the proposal as an application for informal advice at 26th July 2023 DAC meeting, when the Committee offered advice on the development of the scheme. It was noted that the application forms a pair with OFS <u>2023-083428</u> (fabric conservation works), as part of a Heritage Fund project in the Development Stage, but that the latter was not for consideration at 22nd November 2023 DAC meeting.

At the present meeting, the DAC carefully considered the revised proposal and the supporting documents, including the Statements of Significance and Needs, and confirmed that the matters previously raised by the Committee's informal advice had been addressed.

Specifically, it was determined that the proposed works will not have a detrimental impact on the setting of the church. The interior notice boards are the same as those approved under faculty <u>2019-045585</u> (without the additional elements to house the index). The external board is located adjacent to the access to the churchyard from the north. The scale and design do not cause harm to the setting of the Grade I listed building. The DAC Archaeology Adviser also confirmed that it is considered that there is very limited potential for any human remains or archaeological features to be impacted by the excavation of the two specified post holes. As such, it is considered that no further archaeological mitigation would be required.

It was determined that external formal consultation under the Faculty Jurisdiction (Amendment) Rules 2022 is not applicable, and that the application should advance to the giving of formal DAC advice accordingly. As such, the Committee resolved to recommend the proposal. Separately, the DAC advised that the parish should liaise with the Local Planning Authority (LPA) to confirm whether planning permission is required for the external board.

The DAC last considered the proposal as part of a broader application (same OFS application ref.), including toilet facilities within an extension, for informal advice at 31st May 2023 DAC meeting, when the Committee offered advice on the development of the scheme. At that meeting, in relation to the internal aspect, the DAC confirmed its support for the principle of the proposal for a tea point in the north-west corner of the nave, including its location, but that further detailing was required.

At the present meeting, the DAC carefully considered the revised proposal, for provision of the standalone tea point and associated external drainage, including the supporting documents and the Statements of Significance and Needs. The Committee continued to support the principle of the proposal, and considered that the impact of the proposed works on the fabric and setting of the listed church building had been sufficiently identified and justified.

The DAC confirmed that the matters previously raised by the Committee's informal advice had been addressed. Specifically, all pews are retained, and the scheme wraps storage cupboards and

a worktop to the rear and over the pew back. All joinery is to be in oak with an oak laminate worktop, in keeping with the existing timber works but with a lighter (natural) finish. The proposal will also involve provision of a new water supply for the tea point, running from an existing mains connection point, and a new drain. Both will require excavation within the churchyard and therefore have the potential to disturb human remains. A DAC architect member suggested that a direct drainage route would be preferable even though this requires core-drilling of masonry below ground level.

The DAC Archaeology Adviser indicated than the excavations for the service runs will need to be subject to an archaeological watching brief, undertaken by an archaeological contractor selected by PCC. The Outline Schedule of Work provided by the QI architect notes (at para 2.1) that a watching brief will be required. The parish should provide a Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) for the archaeological watching brief for approval by the DAC Archaeology Adviser as part of its application for formal DAC advice.

It was determined that external formal consultation under the Faculty Jurisdiction (Amendment) Rules 2019 is applicable, in relation to the archaeological aspects of the scheme. The Committee indicated that, following approval of the WSI by the DAC Archaeology Adviser, the application should be resubmitted for external formal consultation with Historic England and the Local Planning Authority (County Archaeologist), prior to receipt of formal DAC advice.

The Committee resolved that the giving of formal DAC advice following external consultation, where no formal objections are raised by external consultees and where no 'material changes' are made to the proposal (rules 4.7–4.8 of the 2022 Rules), could be processed by <u>delegated</u> <u>authority</u>, in accordance with the <u>Lichfield DAC Delegated Authority Policy</u> (Amended October 2023). Where these criteria cannot be met, the application will return for full Committee consideration at the next DAC meeting following receipt of the external formal consultation responses.
